The first station is that of the Divine Parent acting as a mystagogue. In this station is a child born from the parent seen in the previous stage. On his head he is carrying a cista mystica (basket of secrets) used to hold <u>hiera</u> (sacred objects) which are revealed only to initiates. In the basket is a pine cone containing a potent seed from which tremendous growth is possible. It symbolizes the vast potential within the newborn child.

It's worth noting that a budding pine cone will open to let pollen into it, and after being fertilized it then closes to protect its seed. It then develops until the seed is ready to germinate, at which time it opens again, releasing its seed so it can take root. A new tree grows and a new pine cone is produced.

The child is also seen carrying a palm branch, like one that is carried by a pilgrim, indicating that he is about to embark on a spiritual journey. This is a new beginning for the Mystes who is fully present, open and receptive to the opportunities ahead.
